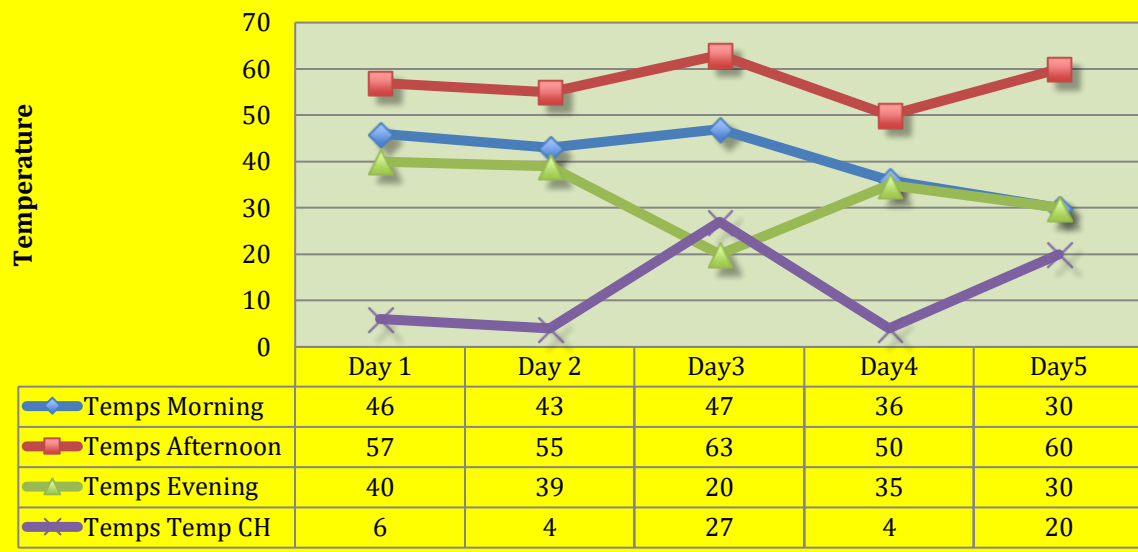
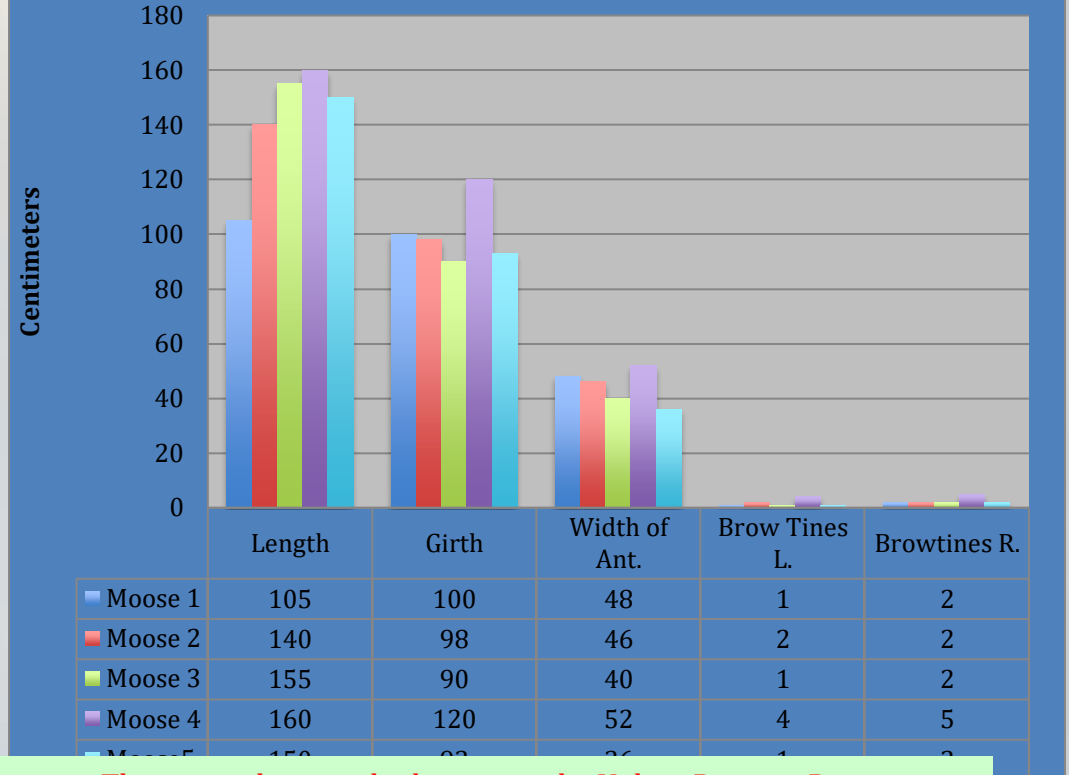


# MOOSE HUNTING TRIP '14

**Moose Measurements**



Relevant education is the way we harvest our food and gather *Atsarpiaq*(berries). We hunt *Tuntuvak*(moose) and try to catch fish. We mainly look for moose to hunt. We also did work while we were on the trip and took measurements and wrote down the data.

Relevant education is important culturally, because we are learning new things and going to new places. They also do the work that is required to do. One way we keep our culture alive is by continuing what our elders were taught and keep teaching the younger what the elders taught us.

We speak in our yup'ik languages when we are spoken to by an elder. We teach the *Mikelnguut*(children) to listen to the elders and make right choices on how they react when an elder tells them to do things. We are taught it is always good to go out hunting/fishing with a *Aipaq*(partner) because who knows what will happen and maybe it can help you with what your doing.

When we have harvested a moose, we go around and share the catch with elders and other family members. When we go on relevant ed. trips, we learn new *Atet*(names) to other places and we learn what the names mean. We do science and math by making calculations when we are shooting the gun, for example, while the moose is running, we give a lead on the moose.

We need to learn more and have new experiences for the younger students, and it makes it a lot more fun on the relevant education trips. These relevant education trips are important because that is the way we live and survive the cold winters.

The moose hunters had went up the Yukon River to Paimiut. Energy is the property of matter that is a capacity to perform work. Matter is anything that occupies space and has mass. Humans use energy all the time, even while sleeping, and reading a book. But they use most of their energy when performing physical work like running, or climbing hills for moose. We receive energy by eating food, which is matter. Energy is formed from the foods we eat and food is matter. But matter can't be destroyed; instead it becomes wastes and a part of you.



This place is an important place because it is one of our main rivers we hunt on and it also has gold someplace in this river, gold has been found around these areas throughout the year.
