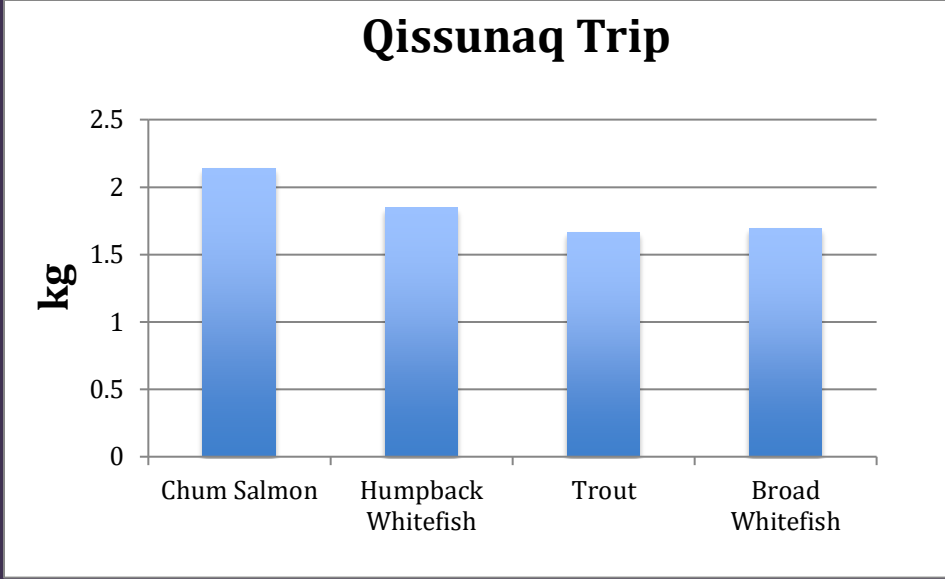


# Qissunaq Trip ~ Tara Tikiun



## Relevant Education English Language Arts Project

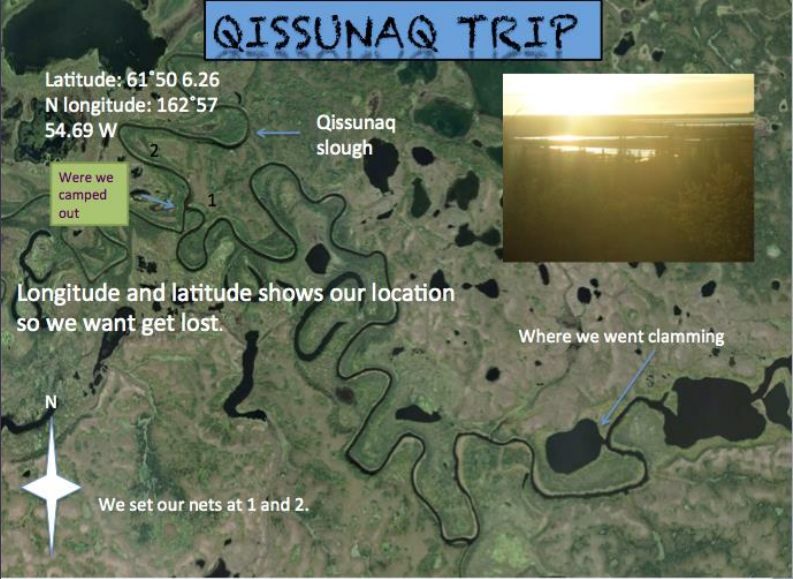
